

As the Shapinsay Sound comes out, the school will just have returned after the October break.

During the last week before the holidays we learned about some aspects of Black History, and took part in the "Show Racism the Red Card" day by wearing red on Friday 9<sup>th</sup> October and donating to the charity. We raised £24 which we sent off to help tackle racism.

The Pupil Council has been formed, and consists of Logan, Leilah, Erika, Dillon and Anwen. They will be helping with the School Improvement Plan, fundraising and with day to day things in the school. We also have two new Junior Road Safety Officers – Matthew and Alfie D. They will be organising competitions and promoting road safety to the other children.

It's been a busy time over the past month with housing, the café/restaurant/pub survey and Ebikes taking up much of our time.

#### **Housing**

As some of you might have seen in the Orcadian, OIC councillors met to discuss and decide whether to sell the Schoolhouse to SDT. They have now agreed to the sale, and the transfer should take place on the 30<sup>th</sup> October. It is anticipated that work to refurbish the Schoolhouse will commence sometime in November. And as already mentioned in last month's Sound, work has already commenced at Number 9 Balfour and is going to schedule.

SDT are in the process of establishing a Housing Subgroup to liaise with the project manager for both housing projects. The first meeting of the subgroup will be in early November with the project manager also in attendance. One of the things the housing subgroup will be looking at is a draft lettings policy. More on this in future issues.

## Shapinsay's Film Festival-True Blue!

Soond Cinema's us to take part in the festival and to host one of its opening weekend movies two years in a row.

Following the success of Shapinsay's first film festival Out Of This World in 2019 including our biggest ever turnout to the Australian film that we put on in our Moon landing themed line up, Soond Cinema has been busy finalising and sourcing the films for our 2020 True Blue Film Festival programme since the New Year so that we were ready with a strong programme of films to competitively bid for funding to enable us to take part in the Film Focus Festival again this year. With this week's news that the 2020 Film Focus Festival will not go ahead and the uncertainty of when, given the current situation with social distancing, the Boathouse will be open for Soond Cinema goers again, Lynne and I have swiftly shifted gears and have put together a virtual programme using Australian films currently showing on Netflix alongside optional pre and post movie Skype cuppa catch ups so that our film festival can go ahead on schedule with a radically different line-up of films.

Shapinsay's 2020 True Blue Film Festival, showcasing 9 Australian films drawn from drama, comedy, thriller, war, western and action movies, will start on Saturday 31st October with Bruce Beresford's classic drama, Ladies in Black and will end on Saturday 28th November with Jennifer Kent's historical thriller, *The Nightingale*. The frequency of films will increase to twice weekly on Thursday and Saturday evenings for the duration of the festival.

Using Netflix based films means that we do not need to worry about the film licensing and advertising restrictions that we are bound by when we show films at the Boathouse under the banner of the SDT's MPLC and Filmbank licences, which allows us to include the full 2020 True Blue Film Festival programme in this month's edition of the Shapinsay Sound.

For anyone wanting to learn more about the Australian film industry before during or after our Australian film festival, David Stratton's renowned documentary series, Stories of Australian Cinema, which is currently available to download on BBC iPlayer, will be just the ticket in providing all you could ever want to know and more about movies Down Under.


Soond Cinema is currently at the beginning of its third, now going virtual, Winter Warmers season, Winter Warmers 3, an annual mixed bag of comedies, romances, musicals, dramas and new releases chosen by folk who come along to the film nights, to help chase away the winter blues. Winter Warmers 3 will run from the beginning of second film festival, True Blue, was all set to run alongside Orkney's 2020 Film Focus Festival, starting on Saturday 31st October with the last film showing on Saturday 28th November 2020. Sadly, Lynne and I have heard this week that due to the ongoing COVID-19 situation, the Film Focus Festival will not go ahead.

Soond Cinema has been lucky enough to have been invited to take part in the Orkney wide Film Focus Festival, which runs for 24 days across 25 venues in 16 parishes including Shapinsay, for the last 2 years. We have also been successful in our bids for funding, for one of a small number of public cinema licences sponsored by Cooke Aquaculture in 2018 and 2019, which have allowed October 2020, taking a short break during our *True Blue Film Festival* and will then start again from Thursday 3<sup>rd</sup> December 2020 until the end of March 2021, taking advantage of weekly films on Netflix with optional pre and post movie Skype cuppa catch ups.

#### **Remembrance on Facebook Live**

2020 is the year where all our ways, traditions and events need to be carefully examined and either cancelled altogether or done in a new and creative way. Remembrance is way too important to cancel – it is our sacred duty to remember for the future generations.

It is equally our duty to look after one another and keep one another safe. To this end, there is going to be a different Remembrance Sunday service than normal. There is not going to be any singing which is not allowed under the current regulations.

The service will start at 10.55 am on Sunday the 8<sup>th</sup> November at the war memorial. It will be streamed live on the Shapinsay Facebook page and therefore we urge everyone who is on Facebook to REMAIN SAFELY AT HOME and watch the service from there. Those who do not have access to Facebook

and would like to remember, please let Julia know in advance (Rev Julia Meason, 874789/711275, <a href="mailto:jmeason@churchofscotland.org.uk">jmeason@churchofscotland.org.uk</a>) so that we know what numbers to expect and to help us with Test and Protect

strategy which is a legal requirement of the Scottish Government (churches are allowed to organise outdoor worship but they need to keep the contact details of those who attend for 21 days after the event in case there is a COVID-19 positive case among those who attended). Those who choose to attend will be required to keep a 2-metre distance from other household groups. Alternatively, you can choose to keep 2-minute silence on your doorstep. Let us remember but let us do so safely.
