Kirk news

We are delighted to announce that we can now sing in church again! We need to do so with masks on, but we can sing. What a delight! We are not allowed, however, to give out hymnbooks on the day so if you would like to come back to church (every Sunday at 12 noon), please let me know and I will happily deliver a hymnbook to you. It will remain with you on loan until such time as the regulations change.

Here is a run through of the current arrangements. We can have a total of up to 25 individuals from up to 17 households in the church —that includes the worship leader. We have a one-way system – we come in through the side door and leave through the main door. Offering is collected at the door to the sanctuary as we come in. The service is also shorter (40 minutes) with singing and the Lord's Prayer, but no flowers meantime. The wearing of face masks in church is now mandatory, unless exempt. Please bring your own masks with you when visiting church. You will be required to sanitise your hands as you enter and exit church. Hand sanitisers are available. Stewards will ask for your contact details for test and trace purposes. All hymnbooks and Bibles are removed so please bring your own for your perusal.

We will continue with our e-services which will be accessible in the same way as at present. The in-person worship will be an adaptation of the e-service for that Sunday – so I am assuming you are either doing one or the other.

You can access our e-services in any one of four ways:

3. By dialling 01856 404667 from your phone and listening to the audio recording of the service. You will be charged as you would

normally be for a local phone call (and that of course depends on your contract).

4. By getting a script of the service by e-mail (do contact me if you would like that).

It's that time of year again where Rhubarb is in abundance. What do you do with it? How do we use it up? We have had some great suggestions: Rhubarb Gin, Rhubarb cordial, the old favourite- Rhubarb jam, Rhubarb Crumble, Stewed Rhubarb with Dumplings and even a Rhubarb Crumble Muffin. We thought we'd share a couple of recipes for you to try.

Rhubarb Crumble Recipe

500g Rhubarb
100g Golden Caster Sugar
3 Table Spoons of Port
140g SR Flour
85g Butter
50g Light Brown Muscovado Sugar
Porridge oats

Put Rhubarb, Caster Sugar and port into a pot, stew till soft.

Put flour, butter and muscovado sugar in a bowl and make into a crumble using your fingertips.

Place stewed rhubarb in an oven proof dish, cover with crumble mix, sprinkle porridge oats over the top and bake in the oven at 180C for over 30 mins till golden.

Rhubarb Crumble Muffins



175g caster sugar
175g rhubarb, halved lengthways then diced
2 tbsp sunflower oil
1 egg
1 tsp vanilla extra
125ml baking powder.
1 tsp bicarbonate of soda
For crumble topping
50g light muscovado sugar
50g plain flour
25g porridge oats
1 tsp ground cinnamon
50g butter

- Heat oven to 220C/200C fan/gas 7. Line a 12-hole muffin tin with paper muffin cases. Stir the sugar and rhubarb together and set aside while you make the crumble topping. Mix together the muscovado sugar with the flour, oats and cinnamon, then rub in the butter until clumpy with your fingertips.
- Stir the oil and egg, vanilla and buttermilk into the sugary rhubarb (don't worry if it's a little bit juicy). Now, add the flour, baking powder and bicarbonate of soda and stir well.
- Quickly spoon into the cases, then scatter each with a thick layer of the crumble mixture. Bake for 15-18 mins until golden and a cocktail stick poked into the centre of a muffin comes out clean. Cool on a wire rack

Shapinsay Picnic - 7th August 2021



The postponed Shapinsay Picnic is planned to take place on Saturday 7th August. This is an opportunity for people to come together for an afternoon of sport.

The event will start at 1pm on the school field. Please enter on foot through the gate at the back of the field where we will take a name for each household attending. We ask that everybody maintains distance from other households in line with the guidelines at the time. We will have sanitiser available for people to use, or people can bring their own. Please do not attend the event if you or anyone else in your household has symptoms of Covid-19.

There will be sporting events for all ages, including throwing, jumping and running events. We will be unable to do the Tug of War if there are distancing guidelines in place. If you are able to help on the day, then please get in touch with Leanne Bews.

After the events, the Picnic Committee will work out points and get certificates written as quickly as we are able, and the prize giving will then be done on the same afternoon. There will be no evening event.

We ask that people bring their own refreshments for during the afternoon, and a picnic tea for afterwards. Please also

bring your own seats or blankets, as there will be very limited seating available. Toilets will be available, but we ask that people wear masks when inside the building, that people sanitise their hands on entering and that people do not congregate in the building. Parents are responsible for their children at all times during the event.

If guidance changes, then the Picnic may still have to be cancelled at the last minute, but we are hopeful that this won't be the case.
