Shapinsay School January 2022

December has been full of festivities in school. We enjoyed a great Christmas lunch, sang a lot of Christmas songs and played party games. The older children played a lot of Christmas songs on violin, guitar and recorder.

On the last day of term we had a Christingle Assembly, with Rev Julia joining us on Teams. The younger class told the Christmas story. We also said goodbye to lan, who is leaving us at the end of term. Thank you to lan for everything you have done over the years. We have a tradition of soaking the P7s when they leave – after 10 years of lan soaking P7s, it seemed only fair to return the favour and we hope you enjoyed the video we posted on the Shapinsay Residents Facebook page! lan, we hope you enjoy planting your new planters which were were a gift from pupils, parents and staff.

We are delighted to welcome Zara to the school, who has joined the P1 - 4 class. We also look forward to welcoming our new staff who we will introduce properly when they start next term.

Nursery

Next term, we will be carrying on with our exploration of traditional stories and tales and making our own story baskets to extend the childrens learning. Also we are looking forward to using our new waterplay/messy trays to learn about capacity and we will be experimenting with sinking and floating.

 $\underline{P1-4}$ completed the Victorians topic by learning about a Victorian Christmas. The classroom was decorated with handmade decorations, and we made our own Nativity scene. We read "A Christmas Carol" and then enjoyed watching the Muppets' version! In PE we have learned to serve using a racket and to hit objects over a net, which is trickier than it sounds! We also enjoyed creating dances to Christmas songs and Let it Go from Frozen.

In January, the class topic will be "Lighthouses". We will be learning about the history of lighthouses, finding out why they are important and making our own lighthouses. We will also be reading the "Lighthouse Keeper" stories and writing our own.

<u> P5 – 7</u>

In English the P5-7 children read a variety of persuasive texts (to learn about the structure and language features of that type of non-fiction) before writing persuasive letters. In science, they learnt about light by doing a variety of experiments involving coloured LED light sources, mirrors and prisms. French work involved learning about school subjects and Spanish included learning vocabulary to do with clothing. The children also found out about Scottish Christmas traditions and learnt to sew various embroidery stitches. In PE they learned how to serve in badminton and played some fun badminton skills games. Thev also choreographed dances to some Scottish tunes, some popular Christmas songs and also to Let it Go from Frozen.

Next term, the P5-7 class will be learning about Europe in their Social Studies lessons; about Islam in RME and investigating forces and motion in science lessons.


