Open to public after judging is completed from 12pm to 2pm (earlier finish time). Judging starts at 10am prompt, and will take place for as many categories at a time as possible. Admission fee of £2 (£1 for concessions). Fair Trade tea/coffee/juice for sale. Pay at the door – no tickets required but first come first served if numbers too high for capacity of venue.

- Parishes invited to submit teams to represent their parish at one table (max 10 persons).
- Parishes need to enter a minimum of 8 categories (more chance of winning if they enter all 13 – so no incentive to do less than they can)
- Rosettes awarded to 1st, 2nd and 3rd placed entries in each class – displayed on tables with product.
- Points awarded to each prize-winner: 1st = 3pts; 2nd = 2pts; 3rd = 1pt.
- Each table/parish judged on presentation of all products, with the theme – **"YEAR OF STORIES"**. Public given chance to vote for their favourite table on arrival after 12noon. Points (also 3, 2 and 1) awarded to three highest polling parishes in this public vote.
- Most tables are sized 1200mm x 1200mm. Some slightly larger.
- When event opens to the public, they will also be able to taste the various products as much as possible/long as they last!
- Winner of the Food & Drink "Parish Cup of Food" will be the parish with most points overall. They will be announced at the end of the event, by senior OFD representative.
- "SWAP funding has been granted for any out-of-pocket expenses incurred for this event."

SHAPINSAY RENEWABLES

The 2021-2022 financial year has finished. It has been one of the most challenging years for the Shapinsay renewables board since the turbine was erected in 2011.

The turbine has endured a number of Orkney winters and we have been lucky so far that breakdowns have been few and far between. This past year our luck ran out. Whirly had a number of breakdowns throughout the year with the longest being across winter months. The winter months are crucial to earning income, the lighter winds in the summer months normally just cover running costs. Over the last four years wind yields have been falling year on year and last year over the summer months the wind yields dropped to its lowest levels since records began. Going into winter (September) the company had a sizable deficit and we needed a strong winter to catch up. The board decided to start a full review to try and lower costs and make efficiency savings. We then had breakdown after breakdown followed by a very long breakdown. Thankfully our maintenance engineers Enercon managed to get us up and running in late January and we have run since without stopping. The turbine still has issues but these are being managed until a full fix is implemented.

As part of the full review the board had to make the difficult decision to make the turbine responders redundant. This wasn't a decision the board took lightly and everything was considered prior to this decision being made. The board would like to express our thanks to Michael and John for all their hard work and attention to detail over the years as responders.

The ongoing priority for the Shapinsay Renewables board is to maximise the money it gives to the community via the trust. When faced with loss of income, savings need to be found to continue supporting the community.

Labyrinth

The labyrinth is a model of a path used through the ages as a tool for pilgrimage, meditation, or prayer. This ancient symbol creates a sacred space to explore as a community



Both the imagery of the circle and of the spiral that make up the labyrinth combine to form a winding, purposeful path representing our journey to the centre of our deepest self and back out again into the world with a broadened understanding of who we are. In science, they will do topics on microorganisms and rocks as well as some practical investigations. In English, they will read a variety of explanation and discussion texts and learn to write their own. French and Spanish will include being able to give personal information such as their favourite sports, hobbies, foods and animals. Technologies will involve using digital microscopes and making moving models with cams.



Elections 2022

As you will be aware, Community Council elections will be taking place this year after the Local Government elections.

The Orkney Community Council system has been recognised by the Scottish Government as a model of best practice in community empowerment within Scotland for the way that Community Councils are involved in decision-making, and this success is due to the dedication of the individuals involved.

The Community Councils also help administer Orkney Islands Council funds at a local level. These funds are used to support various things - community projects, voluntary groups, tourism ventures, kirkyard maintenance and community halls etc.

Any individual aged 16 and over may stand for election for the Community Council representing their home address, providing they are on the Electoral Register.

All candidates will need to complete a nomination form which will be available soon. These must be returned to Orkney Islands Council no later than **Thursday, 16th June 2022**. The election is carried out entirely by postal ballot, and all ballot papers should be returned no later than **Monday, 4th July 2022**. To avoid any confusion, full details of these Community Council Elections and relevant dates will not be published until after the Local Government Elections on Thursday, 5th May 2022.

We hope you will give some consideration to standing to represent your community in these upcoming elections and would be happy to take queries from anyone wishing to stand.

The initial idea is to develop a further two properties through the Scottish Government's Rural and Islands Housing Fund.
