

Shapinsay Sound September 2022

We hope everyone had a great Summer; school is very much back to business as usual. Aine has joined us in the Nursery this session, and everyone else has settled back into school well. We are also delighted to welcome Claire and Esther onto the school team, who have joined as relief cooks.

Thank you so much to everyone who helped with the polytunnel over the holidays; we are now harvesting some of our produce!

Nursery

The children have been using the role play area as a café and we have added scales, recipe books and menus to further this interest. There is also a lot of interest in letters and letter sounds. We have been singing the alphabet song, talking about letter names and sounds, and played letter games and puzzles.

P1 - 4

This term the P1 – 4 class topic is "Made in Orkney". We have thought about all the different things produced in Orkney and have started writing letters to see about visiting some Orkney businesses. In Science the children are learning about Renewable Energy, thinking about the ways energy is produced here. In French the children are revising greetings and introductions, and learning how to describe where they live. In PE we are learning games skills and exploring the theme "up and over".



P5 - 7

In PE the children are learning tennis skills and are travelling across to Kirkwall once a week for swimming at Picky. The children have chosen to create an Orkney History timeline PowerPoint using Orkney dialect where possible. In Science, the children are learning about energy. They will learn about renewable and non-renewable energy sources, different types of energy, how energy is transferred and ways of reducing wasted energy. French lessons are on "Where I live" and Spanish is about Family. RME work will be about the different Christian festivals and celebrations during the year.

Shapinsay's *Soond Cinema* is planning to re-open its physical doors in time for our 4th annual Shapinsay film festival in November 2022. We are grateful for the support of the Shapinsay Community Association who will generously be providing our new home in the Club Rooms. This cannot happen without your support.

To legally show a film outside of your own home is a complex and costly business. In the 3 years that *Soond Cinema* was physically operating prior to the COVID-19 pandemic, we were generously supported by the Shapinsay Development Trust who paid the annual £330 film licensing fees so that any group, not just *Soond Cinema*, could legally show films at the Boathouse.

For us to be able to legally show films in the Club Rooms, we need to apply to the SDT for a SWAP grant to cover the £330



licensing fees for a 12 month period. Soond Cinema is raising funds towards supporting our SWAP application, through our fortnightly Buffed! quiz which is available for £1 at our lovely local shop. Many

thanks to Sheena, Nadia, Carol, Claire and Rachel for helping us to make this happen, we really appreciate your help and enthusiasm. Congratulations to Lenka and Matthew who are our first prize winners!

Scotland's Social Security News

Local Delivery Service

Scotland's social security system is being designed with the people who will use it. At Social Security Scotland we will make sure it is straight-forward and simple for people to access the money they are entitled to and offer support to apply for benefits when it is needed.

We have staff available in Orkney that can provide inperson support to applicants when they need it — our team can meet people in a community venue or in their own homes. The Local Delivery team is made up of specially trained Client Support Advisers who are based in Orkney and will be available to help guide people through the application process in a way that suits them. This service is available throughout the Orkney Islands to all people including existing or new clients. As well as in-person meetings, the Local Delivery team can arrange appointments by phone or video call.

We deliver a number of benefits for families on low incomes, people who need help paying for a funeral, disabled people, carers and young people entering the workplace. For more information on our benefits, please see www.socialsecurity.gov.scot/benefits

Clients can book an appointment by calling us on 0800 182 2222. If you have any communication or accessibility requirements, please let us know in advance so that we can make the appropriate arrangements. You can find out information on all of our benefits and apply online at mygov.scot/benefit

Adult Disability Payment

Adult Disability Payment launches in Orkney on 29 August 2022. Adult Disability Payment is extra money to help people who have a long-term illness or disability that affects their everyday life. It replaces Personal Independence Payment (PIP) for people in Scotland, delivered by the Department for Work and Pensions.

If someone already receives Personal Independence Payment or Disability Living Allowance (DLA) from the Department for Work and Pensions they do not need to apply. We will write to them when we are ready to transfer their award to Adult Disability Payment. This will happen automatically – they will not need to do anything and will continue to receive the same amount of money.

People can apply for Adult Disability Payment if they:

- have a disability or long-term health condition, or are terminally ill
- have not yet reached State Pension age
- live in Scotland

It does not matter if they are working or not working; income and any savings are not considered.

People can apply online at mygov.scot/benefits, by post, through a local face-to-face appointment or via our freephone helpline on 0800 182 2222.

WE NEED YOU!

We have Extended the deadline to the 5th of September to have one last push to get a 2nd worker to ensure this project can go ahead. It comes with a good rate of pay with 16 hours of paid training (Saturdays 17th September and 1st of October are booked in for training days). We have one person lined up already with a great deal of experience, but they cannot do it without support from someone else, no previous experience necessary, training and guidance will be given.

Shapinsay Development Trust has secured funding from the North Isles Landscape Partnership Scheme (NILPS) to employ 2 Youth Workers.

The two Youth Workers will plan and deliver short, regular Youth Club sessions for young people in the local community in a relaxed and informal way with a positive group atmosphere.

The successful applicants will support young people in developing self-esteem; self-confidence, social relationships, as well as widening their horizons.

The Youth Workers and young people will work together to develop a heritage-related project inspired by their island.

Heritage-related could mean, e.g.

traditional skills, culture, arts, history, archaeology, and landscape etc.

This role is short-term between Autumn 2022 and Spring 2023 (28 weeks – four hours per week + 16 hours training and planning)
