Smithy - Work is progressing well on the Smithy, the layout has been changed slightly, the walls are insulated, the kitchen is getting ready for the equipment and we hope to be ready to open early May, hopefully by the April edition we will be able to give you an opening date! Please see photos overleaf to see what is happening!

Balfour Cottage keys will be exchanged today so we are progressing well with that project with feasibility work well underway.

Standpretty – we are very excited to have been awarded a grant from Scottish land fund towards the purchase and feasibility works in relation to the development at the Standpretty site. The following press release was released today:

An area of land on Shapinsay, Orkney is set to be developed into a community hub, following a grant of £92,510 from the Scottish Land Fund.

The land at Balfour, which will be purchased by the Shapinsay Development Trust, also has potential for social housing, self-build plot and an enterprise zone for local businesses.

It is one of three awards made this month by the Scottish Land Fund that will allow groups to purchase local assets and to use them for the benefit of their communities.

Davie Campbell, Project Manager, Shapinsay Development Trust, said: "We are delighted to receive this support from the Scottish Land Fund. This funding will allow the Trust to own and create a vital multi-purpose facility that includes all the elements within the 5 year development plan, which was shaped by the community.

"This is a result of strong community support and hard work from the Trust's board and their staff'. It is an ambitious and exciting project for Shapinsay and hopefully can act as a blueprint for other communities in Orkney"

The Warmhub comes to a close this month, with the last event for the Winter weekdays and weekends being on the 14th of March when the funding comes to an end. If you have enjoyed any of these activities and would like to see them continue, please consider becoming a keyholder and helping to facilitate them! 
Unfortunately we were unsuccessful in our Investing in Communities Fund application to continue our Youth Project (there were 800 applications and only 100 successful projects and only 20 of them were development Trusts!), this means we will need to look into other options to keep things going.

Upstairs in the heritage centre the new office/kitchen space has been added:





In the restaurant all the walls have been insulated, strapped and lined and plasterboard is being installed, ready for taping and filling.



The wall at the entrance has been moved, making the restaurant space a bit bigger

Below the kitchen space might not look like much, but lots of work has gone on to make it ready for the special wall coverings.



The kitchen equipment is all ordered and by the next edition there will be a lot more progress to see in here!



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Shapinsay Development Trust would like to invite tenders for Garden Maintenance at the Boathouse & Smithy Garden.



The tender should include 15 full cuts of the grass on the land around the Boathouse and Smithy Garden, inclusive of the ditches and strimming where necessary.

The first cut should be in April and the final cut in late October/early November according to seasonal growth patterns. Any extra cuts are to be at the contractor's discretion, taking into account the growth of the grass. There should be a maximum of two weeks between cuts. The tender should also include weeding of paths. All grass cuttings should be removed by the contractor and all hard surfaces should be swept clean after each cut.

The contractor is responsible for compliance with the Health and Safety at work Act, including all personal protective equipment and must have their own insurance. The Contractor will supply suitable cutting equipment, ensuring that blades are sharp and properly set, to produce a true and even cut. They will also ensure that all persons operating the equipment are adequately trained.

The contractor should submit a monthly account, in arrears, throughout the cutting season for all works carried out



A **new portacabin** has been purchased by Orkney Islands Council. All items in the current portacabin (books, food bank items) will be transfered to the new one when it arrives in Shapinsay.

Hopefully you all responded to OIC's letter regarding wheelie bins for waste and recycling. We've been told that **wheelie bins** will be delivered from 6th March. The new collection rota will start on Wednesday 22nd March.

Shapinsay School March 2023

Nursery

We have been playing with the blocks lots recently. We have made boats, aeroplanes, dens, and beds. We've cruised to Australia, sailed to Aberdeen, flown to Tanzania and had bedtime stories.

Outside we have been noticing the bulbs starting to grow and have made obstacle courses with the loose parts.



P1 - 4

Primary 1 – 4 children have now started their project on Ancient Egypt. So far, the children have been enjoying adding to the tomb role play area. A particular highlight has been writing curses in hieroglyphs! In maths the children have been learning how to "Count like an Ancient Egyptian" and have been learning how to predict how many blocks are needed to build pyramids. The children have been learning about Ancient Egyptian Gods and Goddesses and will be going on to compare Ancient Egypt to Ancient Orkney. In RME the children will be looking at Bible Stories featuring Ancient Egypt, such as the story of Moses and the story of Joseph.

In French the children have been revising greetings, and are now learning about classroom objects. In Spanish the children have been learning to have basic conversations, asking questions and introducing themselves. In Music they have been learning to play tunes on tuned percussion and recorder. In art they have explored chalk pastels, used wax resist to create solar system pictures and will be scribing using different materials. In PE they have continued to improve their climbing skills and badminton skills.

P5-7

In English lessons, as well as continuing work on explanation texts, the children have been learning to use a wider range of punctuation. Social Studies work has focused on Scotland's history and the Wars of Independence. They have enjoyed learning about William Wallace and the tactics used in the Battle of

Stirling Bridge. In Spanish, the children have begun learning to use the four language skills (listening, talking, reading and writing) in sentences giving opinions about sports. Artwork has included the children working collaboratively to produce a large frieze on Spring. In technologies lessons, the children have been learning about how to keep themselves safe online, including some of the online issues they might encounter and who they might talk to if they do come across an issue. In PE they have continued to improve their climbing skills through a variety of climbing games and activities, they have also been improving their badminton skills and are beginning to learn the rules of doubles games.

Collaborative learning

During the summer term we watched a Newsround episode where someone was making blankets out of crisp packets to give to homeless people in their area. We were very interested in the process and decided to start collecting crisp packets in school to see if we could recycle them to make blankets. In just 3 terms we have collected enough crisp packets to make 3 or 4 blankets with approximately 50 packets per blanket. We worked together to wash and prepare the bags, then Jason and Mrs Bews began ironing them together to make blankets and ironed on a layer of thin plastic packaging material. We are now exploring ways we could use these in school, instead of buying plastic sheeting for projects we will now use crisp packet blankets. If you can think of any uses please let us know.

On Thursday 2nd March, the Library Committee are leading work for World Book Day. Everyone is invited to dress up as a character or author and we will be doing lots of book themed activities.





Air Ambulance Re-procurement Consultation – Last Call for Feedback!

The Scottish Ambulance Service's air ambulance operation mainly transfers patients to and from hospital from remote, rural and island communities. This includes providing air ambulance services to support ScotSTAR retrieval teams.

The aircraft used by the Air Ambulance Service are provided as part of a managed contract which is due to expire. As part of the contract review process, SAS launched a consultation and engagement exercise last year to gather feedback on this important service before air ambulance arrangements are renewed.

SAS is now in the final feedback stage of the consultation and engagement process and is encouraging anyone with views on its Air Ambulance Service to get in touch if they haven't done so already.
