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Shapinsay Development Trust News

Smithy – Work is progressing really well and we are really excited to open! We had hoped to be open early may, but we are going to have to push back by 2 weeks due to some changes we've made to make it better when it does open. This gives us more time to get the staff ready for opening too, so although slightly disappointing, it means we should be able to hit the ground running on opening day!

Balfour Cottages – We took ownership of Balfour cottage on the 28th of February, we'd like to thank Jan for allowing us the opportunity to purchase her home and wish her all the best for the future. We hope that it will be a huge asset to the island. We have plans drawn up almost ready to go to planning next month. (see page 4)

Youth – Funding for the Youth Club project comes to an end in June. We are looking into funding for youth provision for the island and would love your feedback as to what that should look like. Huge thank you to NILPS for funding the project up to this point and to Leanne and Jan C for running the current youth club. We now need to set up a Youth Sub-group to be able to apply for future funding, if you are age 8-24 and would like to help shape the future of youth provision on Shapinsay, get in touch.

Transport – Out of Hours Boat - Harvey is taking some time out from April onwards, so Northerly Marine will be stepping into the breech. This will mean running a reduced timetable for a period of time, please bear with us during this period and we appreciate your patience once more

Cars – If anyone would like to use the electric car, please get in touch with Eileen on 07798570439 this service is subsidised by the trust, so it can be offered for free to islanders, however donations towards running costs are always appreciated

Ebikes – Our initial trial period for electric bike hire has now ended and there will be a price increase. The bikes will no longer be free for islanders in the Summer period.

Shapinsay School April 2023

<u>Nursery:</u> We have been thinking about different letter sounds and making displays of objects beginning with the letter. We started with 'P' and have moved on to 'G'.

We have really enjoyed the opportunity to play in the snow, making snowmen and snowballs. We also took a bucketful of snow inside to see what happens when it gets warm.

P1 – 4: have been continuing to learn about Ancient Egypt. Jason has helped to make a fabulous tomb for us in the classroom, complete with a sarcophagus. We also experimented with fruit and salt, in order to find out why the Ancient Egyptians used salt as part of the mummification process. We turned ourselves into pharaohs in art, complete with ornate pasta neck collars. The children wrote non-chronological reports about the River Nile. P3 children each created a powerpoint and gave a talk to the rest of the class



about an aspect of Ancient Egyptian life.

We visited Maes Howe and Skara Brae to compare life and death in Ancient Egypt and Ancient Orkney.

<u>P5-7:</u> The children have been working on their entries for a competition called 'If You Were an Engineer, What Would You Do?' This has involved:

- finding out about the different engineering disciplines
- learning about the engineering design process
- interviewing engineers online about to find out about their careers and what they do
- evaluating items from school and home against a range of criteria (function, safety, aesthetics, ergonomics, durability, cost, materials and environment)
- devising their own problems to solve drawing possible solutions and annotating their designs
- writing persuasive letters to engineers (explaining what their ideas is, what problem it would solve and why their invention should be built as a prototype).

Comic Relief

Pupil Council organised our Comic Relief fundraising activities. We invited everyone to come to school in



silly or funny outfits, took part in the dance sweepstake and created a change snake. Thank you to everyone who donated their loose change for this - altogether, we raised £126.32!

Music

We have been learning to sing rounds and also to play London's Burning as a 4 part round. The children are



doing really well at playing together.

Children from Papdale and Glaitness schools came to join us for a morning of strings. The children who are learning strings got an

opportunity to play as part of a much larger group, and the rest of the children enjoyed listening. We don't think we've ever seen so many children in our school hall!

World Book Day

The Library Committee did a super job of organising our World Book Day activities. We had lots of interesting characters in school, and the children enjoyed choosing



some new books to enjoy at home. Sheila Garson came in to talk to the children about her Shapinsay book, and the children came

up with some great questions.
