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Piece Place is coming to an end! With the Smithy opening and Alison going to pastures new, it's time to draw Piece Place to a close. Piece place was brought about due to covid restrictions back at the end of 2020 and was funded through the covid fund for a short period of a few months. Alison did all the due diligence to ensure it could open in a covid safe, socially distant way. The community centre was closed, as were all council buildings at that time, so it was decided the Kirk would be a great venue to start it up. Environmental health were consulted, suppliers were found and Piece



Place was born. The initial success of Place Piece SDT meant decided to carry funding it until the Smithy

opened, providing a meeting place for the island on alternate weeks to lunch club. It was decided to keep it free, but to put out tins for donations. These donations were gratefully received towards the wellbeing fund which helped run it and some donations were given to specific charities.

£3481.16 was raised for various local charities, the RNLI, Macmillan Orkney, Orkney MS branch, MND and MD, Ukraine and the peedie retreat. £1535.19 was raised for the wellbeing fund to allow Piece Place to continue and towards other wellbeing projects like Play Piece.

During the winter, to help alleviate the cost of living ciris, it was decided to extend the opening times and add lunches, so soup and sandwiches were added to the menu. This was a very welcome addition for many with numbers increasing to on average, around 40 people per session. The very last Piece Place will be on Wednesday the 10th of May from 1.30-4pm and will be tea, coffee, juice, cakes, scones and meringues. Huge thank you must go to Joy Leslie and Margaret Eunson for doing all the baking for us for the last year or so!


