We had a visit from the SURF awards judges on Monday the 23rd, so we will find out how we got on with that award in December!



Shapinsay School November 2023

In October we learned about Black History Month



and took part in the Wear Red Day to Show Racism the Red Card.

We have welcomed Hadi and Amara to the school and we hope they will be very happy here.

Nursery

There has been lots of talk about 'bigger' and 'smaller' recently and so to develop the interest in size comparisons we have been looking at Goldilocks and the Three Bears and exploring the story sack. We have beds, chairs, bowls and spoons for each of the bears.

There has also been lots of keen interest in learning to use the different wheeled toys – scooters, balance bikes, cars and trikes. We have been learning about staying safe on these by wearing a helmet.

Please save the dates of 2nd November and 7th December for Bookbug sessions, which the nursery children will be joining in with.

P1 - 4

P1 -4 continued their Materials topic by looking at sustainability. They counted how much waste we produced and used it in maths for data handling.

The children thought about how we can limit the amount of waste we produce. In writing the

children wrote persuasive texts about reusing and recycling. To finish up the topic the children looked at the story of the Gingerbread man, and did a variety of experiments and STEM (Science, Technology, Engineering and Maths) challenges around the story.

All of the primary children made gingerbread biscuits.

P5 - 7

In RME the children have been listening to Sikh stories.



In French, they've been learning numbers to 100 and more about French phonics.

English has focused on using a wider range of conjunctions in complex sentences.

Katy Firth, from NILPS, came out to Shapinsay to help the children learn about plankton. They enjoyed taking part in using a special plankton net to collect plankton from by the harbour. They then examined what they'd caught under microscopes and attempted to identify what types of plankton they saw.

The P7 children entered the Orkney Sun2 competition which was part of the Science Festival. They had to compare the effectiveness of single and double-sided solar panels by collecting data and analysing it. They worked out that the E-W panels are better early and late, and the South facing panel is better at or around noon. The judges praised their 'thorough investigation of the effect of the white reflector' and awarded them second prize.




