This plan will be essential for many future grant applications, as funders increasingly expect to see a clear commitment to sustainability in writing. While we've always prioritised sustainability in our work, this process will help us formalise those efforts and outline a clear strategy. We're fortunate to have the guidance of a Development Officer through Community Energy Scotland (CES), alongside other North Isles trusts, to help us shape and implement this plan.



There will also be an opportunity to hear from CES about the projects we are involved in, from Shapinsay Community Council about what it is they do and can offer in the way of support for and from Shapinsay Community Association as to what it is they do and how you could potentially get involved.

In the run up to the AGM, also on the 7th of October, we will be holding a community café drop-in session with community groups like THAW, Shapinsay Men's Group, Scam Action Orkney, Marie Curie, Relationships Scotland etc in attendance, so please use this opportunity to come along and engage with these groups and get a coffee and cake!



### **Community Car Service Update**

As mentioned in the recent letter sent with the surveys, there are some small but important changes to the car service. This is due to our need to apply for a Section 19 permit to keep the service

Although the service operates "by donation" it is still classified as "hire and reward" which requires this permit.

One of the key stipulations under the Section 19 permit, set by the council and the Community Transport Association, is that the service must be "members only."

To make this as easy as possible, we've decided that membership to the car service will be included for free with your Trust membership, which costs just £1.

If you'd like to use the car service but prefer not to join the Trust, simply let us know, and we can send you a separate form.

In the near future, we'll be introducing a booking app that will allow you to make car bookings online (you can still book as usual, and the driver will input the details into the app).

This app will make it easier to see driver availability and track where the car is on its way to you.

Visitors to Shapinsay can still use the car service by signing up for a visitor membership, which will include a small fee.

All bookings for non-residents must be made at least one day in advance, which is our preference anyway for planning purposes.

### **Shapinsay School October 2024**

This term the primary topic is "Our Community". The children have been learning about what makes a community work and thinking about what it needs.

Many people in community roles in Shapinsay have received letters from the children, and we'd like to say thank you for all the replies. We have already had some visits and visitors and have more planned before the October break.

The children really enjoyed their visit to the Smithy, and thanks to everyone there for their time and for making us feel so welcome. In the next few weeks we are also visiting the kirk, the fire station, the shop and Cast Affs. We will also be having visits



from folk from the Development Trust, the Community Council and from Stephen Clackson. In ICT the children are making an interactive map of Shapinsay, and in English the children are making updated brochures about Shapinsay. Art this term is focusing on nature, photography and photo manipulation.

In French the children have been learning about families, and in Spanish the children have been learning about jobs.

In PE the children have been working on netball skills and swimming, and also enjoyed a visit from the Scottish Football Association Roadshow. The new goals in the tennis court are proving very popular.



September saw the Orkney International Science Festival, and we were able to have several workshops in school. The children had a variety of experiences; learning about space, forensic science, rainforests and artificial intelligence. Highlights included revealing footsteps and trying virtual reality headsets to visit Thailand.

Well done to the children (now P7 and S1) who won the Science Festival Primary Schools Science competition where they experimented to find the best material to insulate a water tank. It was lovely to welcome the S1s back into school for their prize giving.

The nursery have been enjoying the sunny weather and lots of outdoor play. We have been reading 'Dear Zoo' and looking at jungle animal activities, matching and numbers.

Some of the bairns attended a Science Festival workshop and had fun collecting natural objects from outside and creating stories with them. We have attended a bookbug session, visited the library van and gone on walks to the shop to buy fruit for snacks.
