


## **Celebrating Volunteers**

The last of the volunteers we are celebrating for 2025 comes from somewhere you might not realise how many volunteers are involved to keep it going – the Kirk!

## Worship Group, Shapinsay Kirk

Shapinsay Kirk has been fortunate over the years to have folk willing to lead worship as well as those who do the weekly Bible readings and look after the music.

Our minister, Julia, is here every third week, but a service is held in the Kirk every week. The Worship Group usually lead a service once or twice a month and we have worship leaders coming from the Mainland on the other Sundays. We may also take special services such as the Remembrance service at the War Memorial and services at Christmas. Occasionally we deliver services at very short notice if the weather or illness stops the planned leader getting out.

At the moment we have three folk who regularly lead worship, Caroline, Kenny and Sheila. We've all been involved for many years and have grown in confidence over that time. We have also all done some training on how to prepare and deliver a service. There's lots of material available to help with this, much of it online, and we regularly use the worship material on the Church of Scotland website and resources like Spill the Beans. Both have prayers, sermon and hymn suggestions as well as the readings for the week. There're also sites like Sermons that Work that have a wide range of sermons based on specific reading and these often provide inspiration.

As well as those who lead worship there's a rota of readers who read the set Bible readings for the week. This can be challenging, particularly Old Testament readings which are

often peppered with unfamiliar names and places that are tricky to get your tongue round! There may also be contemporary readings, maybe for more than one voice. The reading rota comprises Caroline, Edith, Emma, Kenny and Sheila.

Music is also an important part of each service and although we don't have an organist, we do have an amazing digital machine called a Hymnal Plus which is expertly operated by Robert. This gives us access to a huge range of hymns and other church music, played on a variety of instruments and with the ability to vary the speed and volume to suit our needs.

We probably all get different things out of being part of the Worship Group. In the widest sense it's a way of giving something back to our community. By using our skills and talents we are also helping to ensure the continuation of in person, weekly worship here, which we know is important to many of the folk who attend church. On a more personal level it grows your understanding of Christianity and, while it may at times challenge your faith, it also deepens it.
